How to remove your name from old voter rolls

Florida

Instructions

- Step 1:** Confirm your voter registration on the state or county website:
<https://registration.elections.myflorida.com/CheckVoterStatus>
- Step 2:** Notify state or county that you should no longer be registered. Different locations have different removal processes. Here's what we found for Florida:
 - You must contact the **county supervisor of elections where you were previously registered.***
 - Provide the necessary information required by that county.*
 - Ask for confirmation of removal request.*
- Step 3:** Mark your calendar to follow up in 30 days. If your registration hasn't been removed, recontact the registration office.

FAQs

What information is required for my removal?

According to the SOS Elections Division, every county in FL may have a different standard of required information to remove your name from the voter roll. Common information needed is full name, DOB, last four digits of SSN, address or zip code used when you registered in that county, and/or a handwritten signature for verification purposes.

What if I don't remember my information?

The county's supervisor of elections will be able to assist you.

What if I need to remove a deceased family member?

Contact the supervisor of elections where your family member used to be registered and provide the required information. In all cases, you will need to provide proof of death.
