How to remove your name from old voter rolls

Texas

Instructions

- **Step 1:** Confirm your voter registration on the state or county website:
<https://teamrv-mvp.sos.texas.gov/MVP/mvp.do>
- **Step 2:** Notify the state/county that you should no longer be registered. Different locations have different removal processes. Here's what we found for Texas:
 - a. You must contact the county where you were previously registered. Some counties provide a cancellation form on their website. Find a list of county contacts here:

 - b. Provide the necessary information required by that county.
 - c. Ask for confirmation of removal request.
- **Step 3:** Mark your calendar to follow up in 30 days. If your registration hasn't been removed, recontact the registration office.

FAQs

What information is required for my removal?

Every county may have a different standard of required information to remove your name from the voter roll. Common information needed is:

Full name, DOB, last four digits of SSN, address or zip code used when you registered in that county, and/or a handwritten signature for verification purposes.

What if I don't remember my information?

The county clerk or elections division will be able to assist you.

What if I need to remove a deceased family member?

The county where your family member was registered will instruct you on what is required, but in all cases you will need to provide proof of death.
